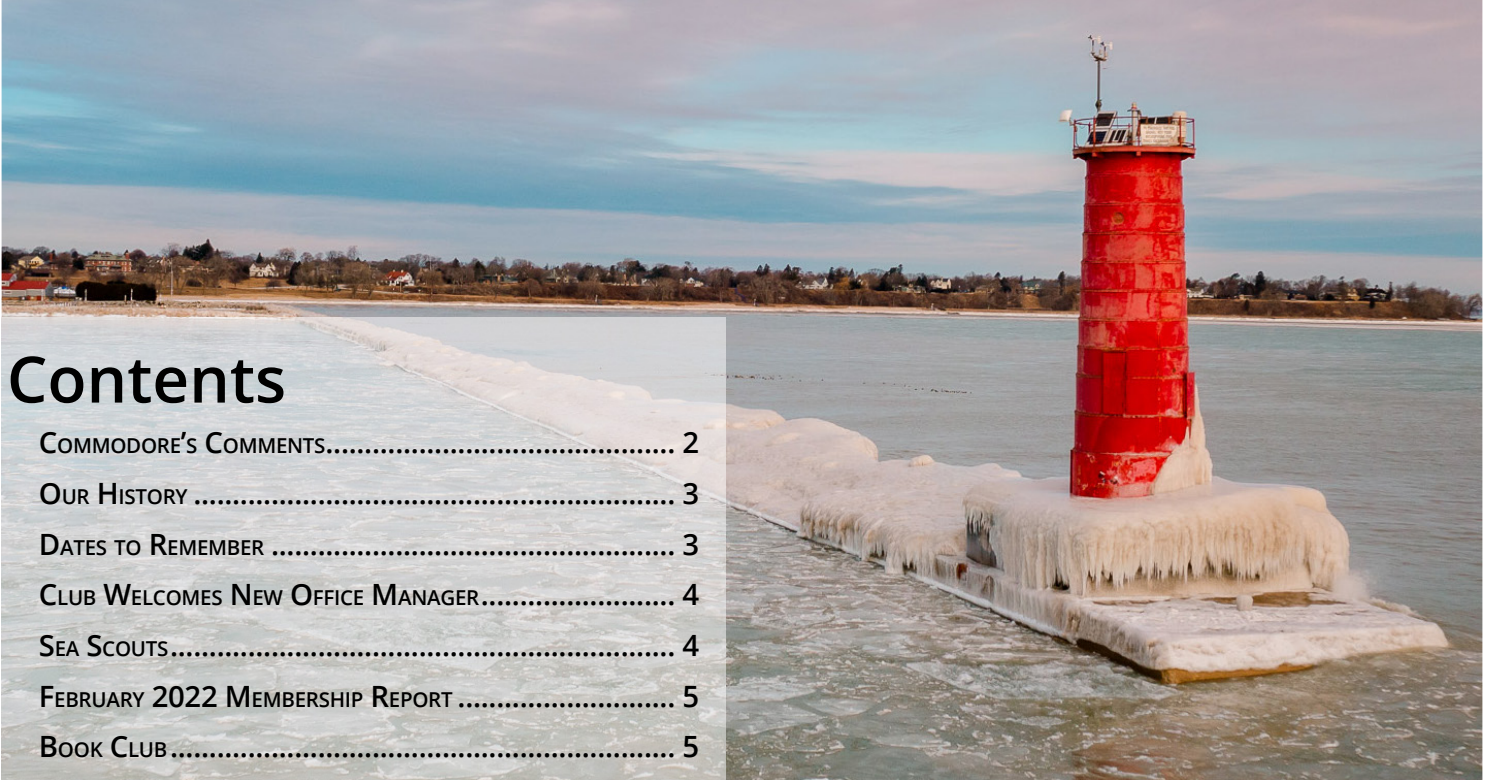

The Mid-Winter Brat fry returns on Sunday March 13, featuring Nashville-based country band Dallas Ugly, followed by the Sea Scouts Chili Cookoff on March 27 – please mark your calendars for both of these great events. It was two years ago on St. Patrick's Day that we had to close our club due to the onset of the COVID pandemic. This year we will be open and there will be a little extra luck for one member. Our History



Above: The happy crew of a Sabre after finishing the Mac in 1959. She was an L Francis Herreshoff 10-Meter that was turned into a yawl to rate better under the CCA rule. She was owned by Romy Brotz from Sheboygan. Peter Reichelsdorfer raced on her, maybe even this one.

Sabre was in Chicago in very poor condition in the late 1960's and early 1970's. The last known owner was David Morrissey. In about 1970 he either had her on a cruise or had sold her to a new owner. She was lying in a marina on City Island in the northeastern Bronx in New York City and was stolen, never to be seen again. A few days after the theft, a boat sank off Cape Hatteras. The crew was rescued but never really told the Coast Guard what boat they were on. The speculation is that this was Istalena's fate. There is a rumor that at one point, some of her "bones" were found, but that may be just a boatyard story.

Sea Scouts

The SYC Chili Cook Off is on for 2022!! Sunday March 27th from noon to 3:00pm you can once again sample dozens of delicious chili recipes for just \$5! As in the past there will be a variety of silent auction items and a 50/50 raffle. All proceeds to benefit the Sheboygan Sea Scouts.

As many of you know, Ship 50 has been sponsored by the Sheboygan Yacht Club since 1932 and is the 26-oldest continuously sponsored sea scout ship in the nation. We are a co-ed BSA Ship that offers watercraft instruction to scouts ages 14 through 20. We maintain a fleet of five Laser sailboats, nine kayaks & four stand-up paddleboards, with access to six Vanguard 420's at Youth Sailing.

Last summer we saw a substantial increase in our recruiting numbers as they went from averaging 6 scouts in previous years to 12. The increase in our numbers resulted in increased demand and use for all of our watercraft. Since our main focus is sailing instruction, our three Lasers were often in use at the same time. This last fall we took delivery of one donated Laser from

the Reichelsdorfer family and purchased another.

Our winter boat building program continues as our scouts continue work on the two canoes started last year. Their goal is to finish both canoes by February 2022. Our scouts are also working on refurbishing a donated 1970's vintage 18-foot Cape Dory Typhoon. Their goal is to have it done in time to sail it this coming summer.

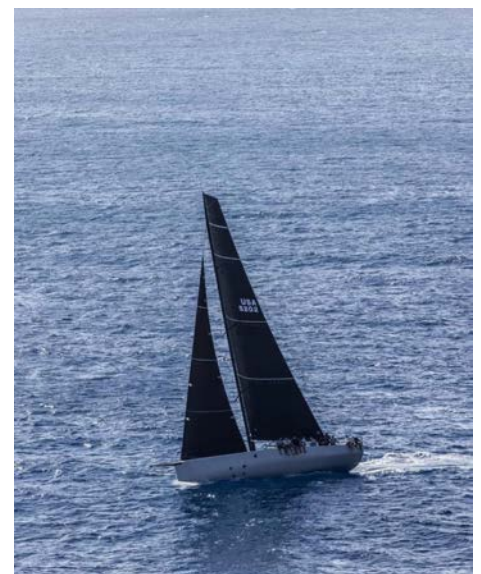
Orlebeke Brothers and Team Callisto Finish Third in Class and Fifth Overall

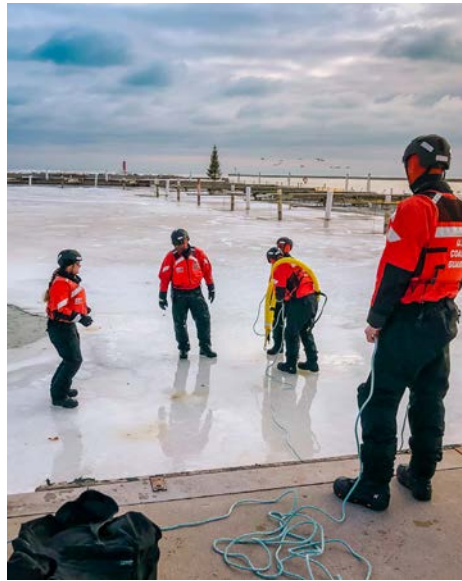

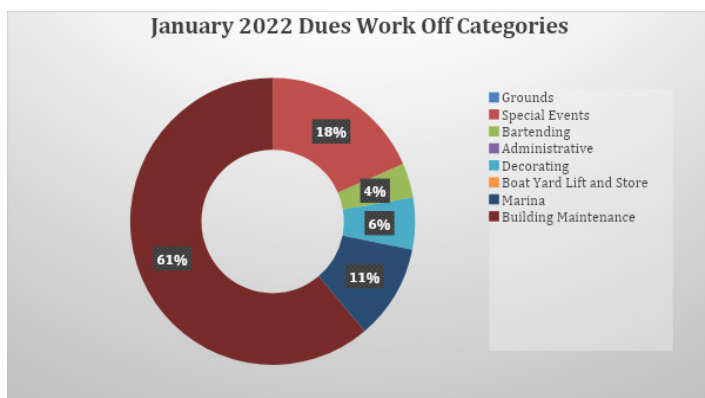
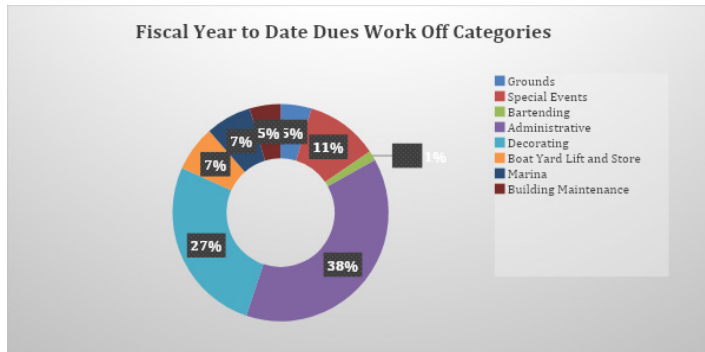
